Invitation to Confession

that it is lack of evidence or understanding, not lack of will or love, that keeps us from following Jesus wholeheartedly.

So in a moment of quiet we examine our hearts, and confess to God where we know we hold back from his call.

Reopening for public worship

We will be opening church for public worship from Sunday 12 July, but it won't be what we've been used to! There will be a said communion service (with some music, but no singing) at 9.30am, and we encourage people to follow this with the service online or on the phone line (01902 504 590) at 11am. This pattern will change as time goes on, and we can hopefully build up our worship together in church again.

We can only open church to a limited number, as we have to keep social distancing intact except for administering communion, when other strong precautions will be in place. In total we can use 19 seats and pews of varying size - so up to 19 individual people or households/bubbles of up to 5 can fit in. Once these are all taken, we will not be able to admit anyone else to church but if this proves to be an issue we will add extra services as needed.

We are required to keep the service 'as short as reasonably possible' and not to encourage people to come early or stay after the service. Please try not to arrive before 9.15am, and if you have to wait outside please keep social distancing!

If you would prefer to wear a face covering you are very welcome to do so, but this is not a requirement.

Government advice is that anyone who is clinically vulnerable should not attend church, but you are free to make a decision in the knowledge of your own situation.

Opening for private prayer

To make it possible to open safely for public worship, there will be changes to the times of opening church for private prayer. After this Sunday (church open 3-5pm) there will be no further Sunday afternoon opening, and the midweek opening (from this week onwards) will be on Wednesday, initially 5-7pm.
